- 4. Use a **red pen** to put a dot on the map where you live or work.*
- 5. If you want, please mark on the map in **the black pen** up to 5 places where you feel connected to Mill Road. Please label them so we know what they are.*
- 6. Please use **the red pen** to draw the boundary area which for you defines the Mill Road area.*
- 7. Finally, please use **the black pen** to answer the questions underneath the map.*
